A Regular Meeting of the Otsego City Commission was held Monday, May 6, 2019.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Trobeck at 7:00 p.m. with the following Commissioners present: Stacey Withee, Lauri Krueger, Brent Milhiem, and Nick Breedveld. Absent: Also present City Manager Mitchell; Finance Director Storbeck; and Fire Chief Weber.

The audience joined the Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The April 15, 2019, Regular Minutes were approved as submitted.

REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE REGARDING AGENDA ITEMS

Robert Alway, 1012 Barton – explained to the Commission, as a Planning Commission member why he voted against the proposed amendment to the temporary sign ordinance and voiced his concern for not allowing more signage during election months.

A. COUNTY COMMISSIONER GALE DUGAN UPDATE

Commissioner Dugan gave an update on the most recent County Commission activities and the April 28^{th} County Commission Meeting.

B. PRESENTATION OF 2019-2020 ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS BILL – GENERAL, PUBLIC SAFETY, EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT, EQUIPMENT DEBT, AND CAPITAL PROJECT FUNDS

Finance Director, Matthew Storbeck, gave an overview of the General, Public Safety, Equipment Replacement, Equipment Debt, and Capital Project Funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. Anticipated revenues for the General Fund \$1,756,510, and anticipated expenditures \$1,936,605. Anticipated revenues for the Public Safety Fund \$1,195,505, and anticipated expenditures \$1,245,855. Anticipated revenues for the Equipment Replacement Fund \$231,345, and anticipated expenditures \$231,345. Anticipated revenues for the Capital Project Fund \$57,215, and anticipated expenditures \$119,670. Anticipated revenues for the Equipment Debt Service Fund \$76,280, and anticipated expenditures \$119,670.

III. PLANNING AND ZONING:

A. CONSIDERATION OF RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PLANNING COMMISSION TO AMEND SECTION NO. 18 OF THE CITY'S ZONING ORDINANCE – SIGN CONTENT – DELETING OR ADDING LANGUAGE THAT WOULD PROMOTE COMPLIANCE WITH STATE AND FEDERAL LAW AND IS CONSISTENT WITH THE CITY'S DESIRE TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY; IN RESIDENTIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL - MAXIMUM SIZE AND NUMBER OF TEMPORARY SIGNS, AS PRESENTED

Manager Mitchell gave an overview of the new proposed amendments to the Temporary Sign Ordinance. He stated that the City's attorney was at the Planning Commission Meeting to review the proposed amendments and why they were recommended. Manager Mitchell stated that to be in compliance, the Temporary Sign Ordinance should be content neutral – not looking

at what is on the sign, only taking into consideration the size and number of signs. A lengthy discussion took place and Manager Mitchell answered questions of the Commission. Manager Mitchell commented that the temporary signs will have to be maintained. Commissioner Milhiem moved to amend Section No. 18 of the City's Zoning Ordinance, Sign Content – Deleting or Adding Language that would promote compliance with State and Federal Law and is consistent with the City's desire to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Community; in Residential and Non-Residential - Maximum Size and Number of Temporary Signs, as presented, seconded by Commissioner Withee. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Manager Mitchell gave an overview of the proposal that was received by Right Way Control Services for weed control for the downtown and City property. He stated that there will be better communication this year. He explained that this is a cost saving measure for the City and reviewed the agreement with the Commission. Commissioner Milhiem moved to authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Right Way Control Services, as presented, seconded by Commissioner Krueger. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY
